Marietta Geray, OSB, member of the Sisters of St. Benedict in Crookston, MN, will present a philosophical discussion on rethinking work. The old paradigm of paternalistic leadership is being replaced by a community and participative leadership model that fits in with the new era of commerce. Sister Marietta is a gifted facilitator and respected educator specializing in ethics. She teaches the graduate and undergraduate ethics and ethical leadership courses at the University of Mary. She has an M.A. in Theological Studies from the University of Dayton and has given numerous presentations on global awareness, ecological consciousness, and morality today.
