Topic and Speaker Background

Healthcare systems must respond to both the challenges of maintaining their own financial health and the challenges of fostering human interactions that facilitate healing. Many decisions made by healthcare professionals are concerned with time allocation. Our speaker, Ellen Aho, Ph.D, will examine current trends regarding time use in healthcare, the role of time in the formation of healing relationships and the ethical dimensions of time management decisions.

Ellen Aho, Ph.D. is an Associate Professor of Biology at Concordia College. She teaches courses in Biomedical Ethics, Microbiology and Molecular Biology as well as advises students who are pursuing careers in healthcare and medical research. In her ethics course she examines contemporary issues in biomedicine from several perspectives including biology, medical ethics, sociology, and economics.
