Topic and Speaker Background

What are the ethical issues in politics that are facing our society today? Are politicians less ethical today than previously? Ed Schafer had thirty years experience in the rural sector before serving as governor of North Dakota (1992-2000). He has a degree in business from the University of North Dakota and an MBA from the University of Denver. He will present his perspective of ethics in politics over the past years and comment on the changes and relevant issues facing us today. His main concern is the credibility of government in the long-term. He will discuss issues of negative campaigning and ethical standards for the future.
